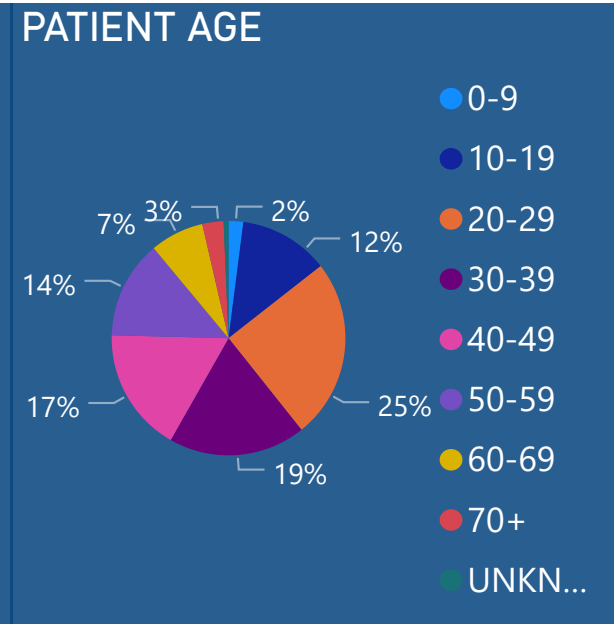
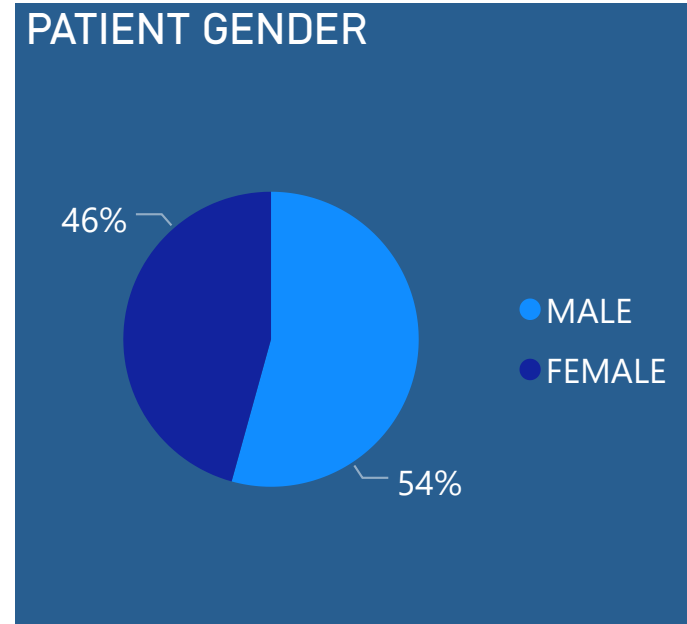

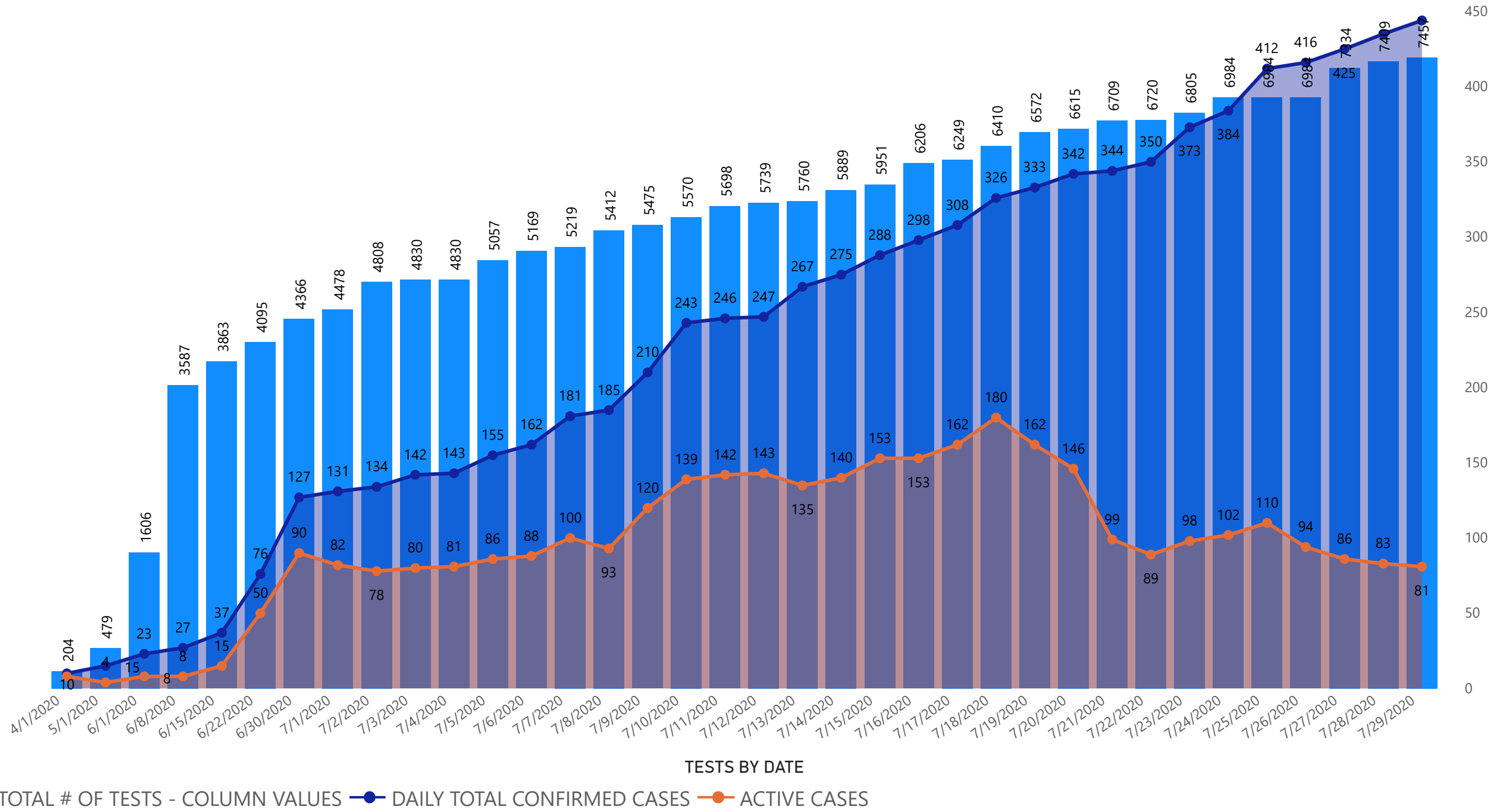

TOTAL # OF TESTS - COLUMN VALUES



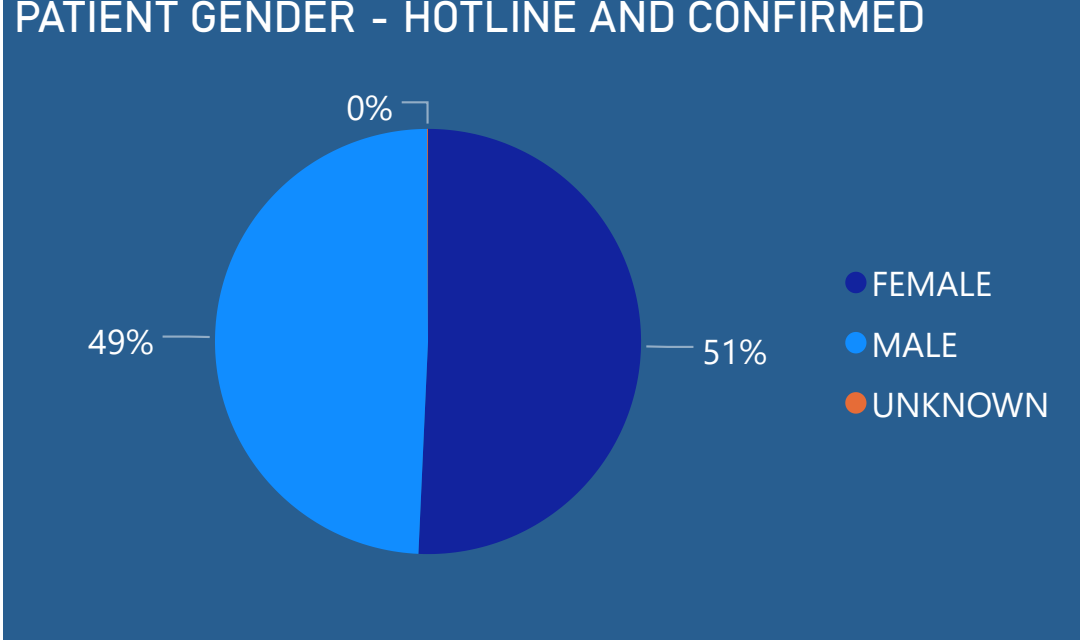
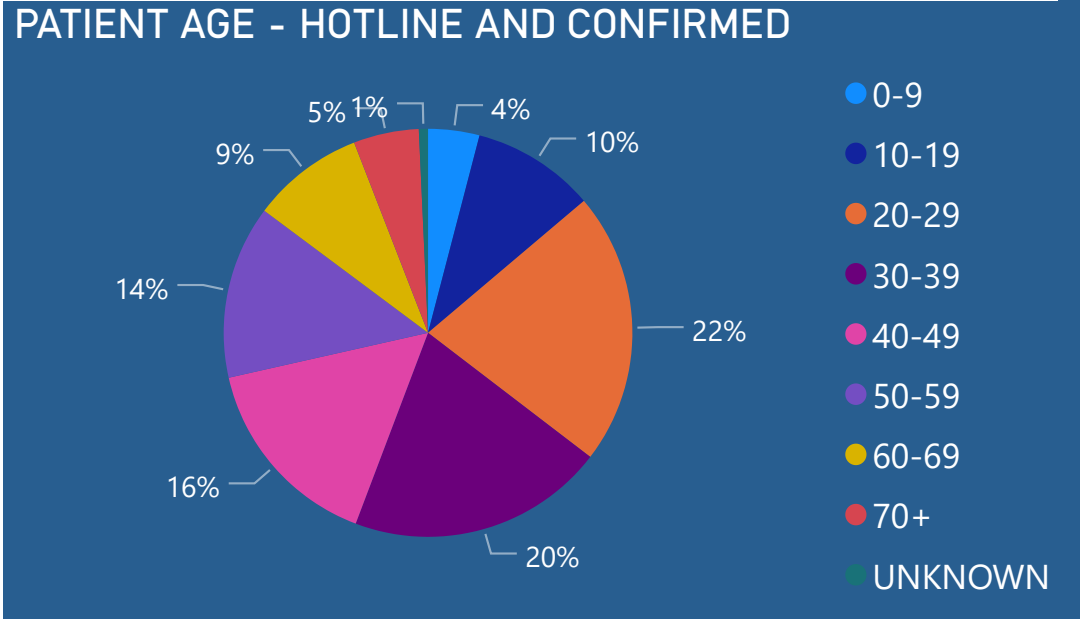
COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

*Presumed positive means that a person had mild to moderate symptoms consistent with COVID-19 OR was a close contact of a confirmed case. Individuals are advised to self-isolate to reduce potential exposure to others and prevent community spread of the virus. In some cases, patients are referred to a higher level of care for further evaluation and testing.

*Presumed negative means that a person did not have symptoms consistent with COVID-19 or contacted the hotline for testing related to travel requirements or pre-medical procedure requirements.

ELKO COUNTY COVID-19 CASE UPDATE – 7/29/2020

Elko County is reporting nine new cases and eleven recoveries today. Two cases are currently hospitalized, both at a hospital outside of Elko.

In effort to slow the spread of the virus, Elko County continues to encourage individuals to practice social distancing, not socialize in big groups, wear a mask, and practice general hygiene and cleanliness.

The breakdown of total confirmed cases is as follows:

- 444 confirmed cases
- 81 active cases
 - 2 active cases hospitalized
- 361 recovered cases
- 2 deaths

The Nevada Health Response website has updated information regarding the positivity and case rates for Elko County, which are two important indicators of elevated disease transmission risk in our area. This information can be found at <https://nvhealthresponse.nv.gov/>.

All new cases have been confirmed through PCR testing. Each case is unique to an individual. Elko County has not had any cases where an individual has had a confirmed case which has been resolved and later tested positive again.

Due to medical privacy requirements and to protect their identity, no further information about the case will be released.

The hotline can be reached at 775-777-2507 or by texting or e-mailing covid19@elkocountynv.net Monday through Friday from 9am to 5pm (closed from noon to 1pm for lunch).

In addition, Dr. Bryce Putnam encourages the public to help stop the spread of respiratory illnesses by taking personal accountability and practicing preventative measures such as wearing a mask while in public and:

- Avoiding close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others.

- If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. This will help prevent spreading your illness.
- Covering your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. Serious respiratory illnesses are spread by cough, sneezing or unclean hands.
- Washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoiding touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe. Remember to clean your cellphones.

People with COVID-19 have reported a wide range of symptoms – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness.

Keep an eye out for symptoms that may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with the following symptoms should reach out to their healthcare provider or call the COVID-19 hotline at (775) 777-2507 or text or email covid19@elkocountynv.net.

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If you have any of these **emergency warning signs*** for COVID-19 get **medical attention immediately**:

- Trouble breathing
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion
- Inability to wake or stay awake
- Bluish lips or face

*This list is not all inclusive. Please consult your medical provider for any other symptoms that are severe or concerning to you.

Call 911 if you have a medical emergency: Notify the operator that you have, or think you might have, COVID-19. If possible, put on a cloth face covering before medical help arrives.
