


COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

ELKO COUNTY COVID-19 CASE UPDATE – 10/23/2020REPORTING 12^{TH} DEATH

Elko County is reporting a twelfth COVID-19 death, the second this month. The individual was a Spring Creek resident in his 40s who was hospitalized at the time of his passing. We extend our heartfelt sympathies to his family, friends, and the community.

Elko County is reporting twenty-five new cases and fifteen recoveries. Eight active cases are currently hospitalized.

We encourage every member of the community to take extra care in preventing the spread of the virus by staying home if you are sick, wearing a face covering while in public or when social distancing is not possible, practicing good personal hygiene, and limiting social gatherings.

Medallus Urgent Care is also providing free COVID-19 testing to anyone who would like to test. Those who are encouraged to test include individuals experiencing symptoms consistent with COVID-19 and those who have been a close contact of a confirmed case. Walk-ins are welcome. Individuals may also call (775) 400-1510 or visit the telemedicine portal at <u>www.medalluselko.com</u> to schedule an appointment.

The breakdown of total confirmed cases is as follows:

- 1,326 confirmed cases
- 202 active cases
 - o 8 active case(s) hospitalized
- 1,112 recovered cases
- 12 deaths

Each case is unique to an individual. Elko County has not had any cases where an individual has had a confirmed case which has been resolved and later tested positive again. Due to medical privacy requirements and to protect their identity, no further information about the case will be released.

In addition, Dr. Bryce Putnam encourages the public to help stop the spread of respiratory illnesses by taking personal accountability and practicing preventative measures such as wearing a mask while in public and:

- Avoiding close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others.
- If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. This will help prevent spreading your illness.
- Covering your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing.
 Serious respiratory illnesses are spread by cough, sneezing or unclean hands.
- Washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoiding touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe. Remember to clean your cellphones.

People with COVID-19 have reported a wide range of symptoms – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness.

Keep an eye out for symptoms that may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with the following symptoms should reach out to their healthcare provider or call the COVID-19 hotline at (775) 777-2507 or text or email covid19@elkocountynv.net.

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose

- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

If you have any of these **emergency warning signs*** for COVID-19 get **medical attention immediately:**

- Trouble breathing
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion
- Inability to wake or stay awake
- Bluish lips or face

*This list is not all inclusive. Please consult your medical provider for any other symptoms that are severe or concerning to you.

Call 911 if you have a medical emergency: Notify the operator that you have, or think you might have, COVID-19. If possible, put on a cloth face covering before medical help arrives.
